This year's fish species are <u>Kokanee</u>, <u>Landlocked Salmon</u>, <u>River/Ocean King Salmon</u>, <u>Striped Bass</u>, <u>Rainbow Trout</u>, <u>Brown Trout</u>, <u>Steelhead</u>, <u>Lake Trout</u> (Mackinaw), Large Mouth Bass, Crappie, Catfish, Shad, Ling Cod and Halibut.

Winners will be announced after November 30th and prize money will be awarded at the January 2023 Breakfast Meeting.

Will Fish Tackle Report by Craig Newton

With a few winter like storms conditions have changed for the better for the rivers. Increased flows and fresh water making its way down the system have brought a new push of salmon and early arrival steelhead upstream.

The late fall run salmon has begun and fish are coming through in small pushes resulting in hit or miss fishing. The hope was that cooling water temperatures would turn the bite on and it has to some degree. Striper fishing in the upper Sacramento and Feather Rivers has started to produce large resident stripers. The Delta striper bite has been fair when the biters are located.

COLLINS LAKE: Winter trout stocking has begun and the fishing has improved accordingly. Run off from recent storms has colored the water making trolling difficult. Bait fishing during the winter months when the water is stained has been the best approach.

ENGLEBRIGHT: The trout trolling continues to produce in front of the marina. Up river will provide the best opportunity for browns.

FOLSOM LAKE: The 5 MPH speed limit is still in place and recent rains have brought color to the water. The bass bite continues to be the bright spot for Folsom. Anticipate the trout fishing to improve as we move into the winter months.

OROVILLE LAKE: Bass fishermen are doing well on spots. No recent landlocked king action to add.

DELTA: Striped Bass fishing has been fair with decent catch counts when you find the school that wants to bite. Lots of fish in the system but many are reluctant to commit to trollers. Bait fishing will be the best bet for a while.

SACRAMENTO METRO: Late fall Salmon have been making their way through the Metro area over the last few weeks with some success for those who run into a school. Fish are holding on the way up as the water temps have come down into the 50s. Some fish are taking plugs backtrolled on anchor at Verona and below the American River. Trollers are doing better south of town from the yacht club to Freeport. With the upper American River closing on October 31st the only option is to fish below Ancil Hoffman Park. Some fish are taking backtrolled plugs below River Bend Park. The dredger hole has produced a few fish for those willing to fish in the dark.

PYRAMID LAKE: Fishing continues to be slow as the lake turns over. Count on much improved opportunities as things settle into a winter pattern in the next week or two. Please error on the side of caution when you visit the lake. Three boats sank at the ramp attempting to take out after conditions changed. If conditions are questionable keep the boat on the trailer and live to fish another day.



2022 - 2023 Recreational Crab Season

Dungeness Crab

(taken from the California Department of Fish and Wildlife website.)

Note: Currently, <u>crab traps may not be set or fished in ocean waters</u> due to an elevated risk of marine life entanglement. The use of hoop nets and crab snares is permitted (see this updated <u>summary of regulations for hoop net use north of Point Arguello</u>, and <u>additional information</u> including Frequently Asked Questions about crab traps and hoop nets). Please visit the <u>Whale Safe Fisheries</u> web page for the latest information, or to sign up for updates.

The <u>recreational</u> fishery for <u>Dungeness crab</u> (Metacarcinus magister) is open from November 5, 2022 through July 30, 2023 in Del Norte, Humboldt and Mendocino counties. The daily bag limit is 10 crab, and the minimum size limit is 5 3/4 in chess. Recreational crabbing is not allowed from vessels licensed for commercial Dungeness crab fishing.

Review <u>crab measurement methods</u> (PDF) and <u>current California ocean sport fishing</u> <u>regulations</u> for more Dungeness crab fishing information.

Remember - <u>Recreational</u> take of Dungeness crab by other methods, including hoop nets and crab snares, is not affected by the temporary trap restriction and is allowed statewide beginning Nov. 5, 2022.
