One can only hope that the weather we are experiencing will bode well for this years fishing adventures. Reservoirs are filling and flows through the rivers are higher than we've seen in some time. As of Tuesday pm, January 10, National Weather Service has Shasta Lake at 41% of capacity or 67% of the average storage for the date. Lake Oroville is at 46% of capacity or 85% of average storage for the date. Folsom Lake is currently at 42% of capacity or 100% of the average storage for this date. January Speaker: James Stone Executive Board President Nor-Cal Guides and Sportsmen's Association



Our January 20th breakfast meeting Speaker will be James Stone, Executive Board President of the Nor-Cal Guides and Sportsmen's Association. James will share the latest information on Sacramento Valley Salmon Management. He will be discussing the current process of setting the ocean salmon seasons, including the river escapements. The process starts in February at the state level moving into the federal level of the PFMC Pacific Fisheries management council. From there, after the ocean season is set we move into the state process of the inland fishery.

In addition he will discuss challenges over the past few seasons and goals for the future for raising

escapement for inland future fisheries and species reproductions. James works advocating for our Northern California hunting and fishing opportunities thru the Nor-Cal Guides and Sportsman's Association. You can find more information about NCGASA at www.ncgasa.org.

CDFW AWARDS \$11 MILLION FOR FISHERIES HABITAT RESTORATION PROGRAM PROJECTS

The California Department of Fish and Wildlife (CDFW) today announced the selection of 25 projects that will receive funding for the restoration, enhancement and protection of anadromous salmonid habitat in California watersheds.

The grants, which total \$11 million, were awarded through CDFW's Fisheries Restoration Grant Program (FRGP). FRGP was first established in 1981 and since 2000 has included funding from the National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration's (NOAA) Pacific Coastal Salmon Recovery Fund, established by Congress to reverse the declines of Pacific salmon and steelhead throughout California, Oregon, Washington, Idaho and Alaska.

"As California continually feels the effects of climate change, rising sea levels, prolonged drought, more extreme temperatures and extreme precipitation events, restoring degraded river ecosystems is more important than ever before," CDFW Director Charlton H. Bonham said. "These FRGP funded projects will help restore the refugia salmonids need."

In response to the 2022 Fisheries Habitat Restoration Grant Solicitation, CDFW received 50 proposals requesting more than \$38 million in funding. As a competitive grant program, proposals underwent a rigorous technical review process which included CDFW and NOAA scientists.

The 25 approved projects will further the objectives of state and federal fisheries recovery plans, including removing barriers to fish migration, restoring riparian habitat, recovering wildfire impacts detrimental to rivers, and creating a more resilient and sustainably managed water resources system (e.g., water supply, water quality and habitat) that can better withstand drought conditions. These projects further the goals of California's Water Action Plan and CDFW's State Wildlife Action Plan, as well as addressing limiting factors specified in state and federal recovery plans.

CA Fishing License Now Valid For 365 Days

Fishing Licenses are now valid for 365 days from the date of purchase. From the <u>CA</u>
<u>Department of Fish and Wildlife</u> website - various licenses, permits, tags, and other
entitlements continue to be available for purchase using the following sales
channels:

- In person, through independent license sales agents (such as a local sporting goods store, large discount store, or a bait and tackle shop). Search for a license sales agent near you(opens in new tab)
- Online, through CDFW's <u>Online License Sales and Services</u> website(opens in new tab)
- · See the variety of items that can be purchased online.
- Over the telephone, through CDFW's authorized telephone sales agent at (800) 565-1458.

FYI - In 2022, the following amount of licenses and validations were sold in the state of California: Annual Resident Fishing License - 983,010; 2nd Rod Validation - 321,790; North Coast Salmon Report Card - 18,169; Steelhead Report Card - 45,739; Sturgeon Report Card - 38,867.

And just so you know, the Annual License with a 2nd Rod Stamp is 7" long; the Salmon Report Card is 42" long; Steelhead Report Card is 23"; the Sturgeon Report Card is 32".

Members Only Stampede Kokanne Fishing Tournament Thursday June 15th, 2023 Stampede Camping Tuesday June 13th 2023 through Friday June 16th (Checkout Day)

The Roster Tails Fishing club is planning next year's members only <u>Stampede</u> <u>Reservoir</u> Kokanee fishing Tournament for <u>Thursday June 15th</u>, <u>2023</u>. In addition, the club has reserved the Prospector group campsite at the Emigrant Group campground starting on Tuesday June 13th through Friday June 16th, 2023 (checkout day). This group campsite is next to Stampede Reservoir, between the Logger campground and the dam. The Prospector group campsite has room for 15 vehicles and 50 guests, the site has water and bathrooms with no showers.

Fishing Reports from Members

Bruce Hansen and Shawn Conlan fished Folsom lake on December 20th before the big storms came through. We launched at 7:30 AM and started trolling from the Granite bay ramp with speedy shiners. We were marking lots of fish but no hungry ones. Once we got to the dam we slowed down and switched to hoochies and wedding rings. Nailed 3 real fast on mostly green near a flock of feeding birds, then nothing. Trolled back to the launch ramp after switching back to speedy shiners with no action till we were in front of the ramp and started to pull in the rods. We had three more on in a few minutes and then it shut off again. We were trolling with 2 lead core lines on long rods and 2 on downriggers. Marked a lot of big fish deep but the hits were in 17-25'. Ended the day with 3 holdover rainbows and 3 salmon.
